For each day of Lent, have your children do alms by counting things. For the number of items they count throughout the house or wherever, they give coins in the amount of what they counted. At the end of Lent, let them place the money they collected into their rice bowls.

Suggested items to count: doors, tables, beds, pictures on walls, windows, pages in newspaper, trees in yard, trash cans, napkins, spoons, bowls, TVs, lamps, pot holders, towels in bathroom and so forth.
